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### **Exploration - Understand Our Country and the World**

Exchange Programme, providing about 100 000 exchange quotas every year, which is sufficient for every student to join at least one Mainland exchange programme in the respective primary and secondary stages. To tie in with the senior secondary subject of Citizenship and Social Development, the EDB fully subsidises students to participate in Mainland study tours once. (EDB)

Completed. The EDB has resumed the Students Mainland Exchange Programme in the 2023/24 school year, providing about 100 000 exchange quotas every year, which is sufficient for every student to join at least one Mainland exchange programme in the respective primary and secondary stages. As of the end of December 2023, over 110 schools and about 9 000 students completed the Mainland exchange programmes.

Besides, Mainland study tours of the senior secondary subject of Citizenship and Social Development (CS) were kick-started in April 2023. Over 43 000 senior secondary students completed CS Mainland study tours in the 2022/23 school year. It is estimated that over 50 000 senior secondary students will complete CS Mainland study tours in the 2023/24 school year.

17. At present, there are around 780 publiclyfunded primary and secondary schools establishing over 2 100 sister schools pairs with their Mainland counterparts. EDB is targeting to achieve an increase of 10% in the number of local schools participating in the Sister School Scheme by the end of 2023. Through participation in sister school exchange activities, more Hong Kong students will be able to enhance friendship with their sister schools' counterparts, broaden their horizons and deepen their understanding of the Mainland, so as to enhance their sense of national identity. (EDB)

#### **Exploration - Improve Special Education**

22. Starting from the 2022/23 school year, hospital schools will be provided with additional resources provide to hospitalised students suffering from injuries or diseases with a holistic senior secondary curriculum and enhanced life planning education, with a view to facilitating re-integration their into mainstream schools after recovery. The Strength-based Programme under the Project on Whole School Approach to Providing Tiered Support for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder will also be expanded to help senior secondary students with autism spectrum disorder unleash their potential and strengthen their life planning. This will benefit about 100 secondary schools. (EDB)

Completed. The EDB has increased the resources and manpower provision for the hospital schools in the 2022/23 school year to enhance their senior secondary education services. Besides, 25 Strength-based Programmes under the Project on Whole School Approach to Providing Tiered Support for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder were implemented in the 2022/23 school year benefitting nearly 300 students from around 100 secondary schools.

#### Hope - Capitalise on the Positioning of Hong Kong for Career Development

23. We will continue to organise "Set Sail for GBA - Scheme for Financial Leaders of Tomorrow" to help Hong Kong's young people to understand the development of our country and encourage them to grasp the opportunities brought about by the Greater Bay Area (GBA) development in their future career planning. (FSTB)

The 2023 Set Sail for GBA -Completed. Scheme for Financial Leaders of Tomorrow programme, co-organised by the FSTB, the Municipal Financial Shenzhen Regulatory Bureau and the Greater Bay Area Homeland Youth Community Foundation, was successfully held from June to July 2023. More than 30 local studying undergraduates related subjects undertook a four-day trip in the GBA and a oneday pre-employment training as well as a six-

Completed. In the 2023/24 academic year, the EDB added 1 000 subsidised places for students studying top-up degree programmes under the "Study Subsidy Scheme for Designated Professions/Sectors". About 30% of them are for construction-related full-time programmes. This makes tuition fees more affordable and helps encourage young people to enroll.

The DoJ plans to set up an in-house alliance of young lawyers, tentatively named "Friends of DoJ", to enable young government lawyers who have been with the DoJ for less than seven years to network and share their experiences, and to encourage their active participation in activities and development of the legal profession. The DoJ has established the "DoJ Completed. #### **Hope - Enhance Employability of Young People**

31. The Labour Department (LD) is exploring with the ERB to strengthen collaboration on pre-employment and on-the-job training under the Youth Employment and Training Programme (YETP). Under the new arrangement, the ERB offers about 700 courses, including tailor-made courses for young people and vocational skills courses covering 28 trades, for trainees of the YETP. (LWB)

Completed. The collaboration has been running smoothly since its implementation on 1 April 2023 and will be carried out continuously.

#### **Hope - Support Innovation and Entrepreneurship for Youth**

32. Continue to support local bazaars to create business opportunities for small business owners including young people. (HYAB)

The three "Happy Hong Kong" Completed. Gourmet Marketplaces organised by the Home Affairs Department (HAD) from April to June 2023 were successfully held. Amongst them, the Gourmet Marketplace held on Hong Kong Island provided a designated youth area for young merchants to set up their booths, and young merchants also participated in the other two Gourmet Marketplaces held in Kowloon and the New Territories. In the series of "Day x Night Vibes @ 18 Districts" activities being organised by District Offices and District Councils across the territory starting from the end of January 2024, young merchants are invited to set up booths at various local bazaars as well.

33. The Government will launch the \$10 billion "Research, Academic and Industry Sectors One-plus Scheme". Starting from 2023, it will fund on a matching basis, at least 100 research teams in universities which have good potential to become start-ups to commercialise their R&D results. (ITIB)

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Completed. The "Research, Academic and Industry Sectors One-plus Scheme" was launched on 18 October 2023. The first application solicitation exercise closed on 30 November 2023. Assessment on the applications is underway. It is expected that the first batch of application results would be announced in the first quarter of 2024.

### Hope - Facilitate Young People's Integration into the Overall Development of Our Country

34. The Government launched the pilot "Greater Bay Area Youth Employment Scheme" in 2021. The feedback from the participating enterprises and graduates was very positive. After review, the Government will regularise the scheme to encourage enterprises with operations in both Hong Kong and Mainland cities of the GBA to employ graduates from Hong Kong's universities. We will launch the regularised programme in the first half of 2023, and the enhancement measures include: setting up a dedicated team to take forward the scheme strengthening liaison with enterprises, post-secondary institutions, employer groups and other stakeholders; providing practical employment information in the GBA to potential graduates with interest earlier; following up on the employment situation of graduates during and after their participation in the programme; and stepping up publicity and promotion to share the success stories of participants so that Hong Kong youths can gain a better understanding the development opportunities in the GBA. (LWB)

The regularised Greater Bay Area Completed. Youth Employment Scheme has been running smoothly since it was launched by the LD on 1 March 2023 and will be carried continuously. To facilitate more enterprises and young people to join the scheme, the recruitment period of 2023 cohort was extended to 31 December 2023. As at 31 December 2023, the LD received 2 540 job vacancies from 278 enterprises and 702 allowance applications from enterprises after the participants' commencement of employment.

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#### **Hope - Address Youth's Housing Needs**

35. We will re-launch the Starter Homes projects in the Land Sale Programme in the 2023-24 financial year. In the past, more than 85% of the applicants for SH were young people aged 40 or below, and more SH projects will help young people in home ownership. (HB, DEVB)

Completed. On 23 June 2023, the Government put up for tender a private residential site at Yau Kom Tau, Tsuen Wan, for developing SH. The Government rejected the tender received at the close of the tender exercise because the tendered premium did not meet the Government's reserve price. The HB has invited the Hong Kong Housing Society (HKHS) to take up the SH project, and is discussing with HKHS on the detailed arrangements in taking up the project.

## **Empowerment - Promote Sports, Arts and Culture**

Leisure and Cultural Services Department 36. (LCSD) will organise more community arts activities targeting at young people, among them is the Youth Music and Dance Marathon which serves as a performance platform for young musicians and dancers. Plans are underway to allow more performers/ensembles to participate for showcasing their own works, offering performance opportunities for more young people to reach out to different communities, as well as opportunities for youngsters to join cultural activities and arts festivals staged in the Greater Bay Area and share experience with arts groups and artists of the region. These aim to broaden their horizons, cultivate and arouse their personal interests in the arts and cultural industry, and facilitate them to set up clear career goals and build up proper personal values. (CSTB)

Completed. The dance performance "Rhythm Divine" (8 July 2023) as well as the music gala "Youth Band Marathon" (9 July 2023) were completed smoothly, featuring 42 performers/performing ensembles and attracting around 4 700 participants.

- 37. Continue to curate and provide different platforms for local young artists and graduates/prospective graduates universities/academies to showcase their talents to various audience groups and to be the new forces in the arts industry. Furthermore, different types of lighthearted programmes and popular dances targeted for young audiences organised, in order to promote performing arts and culture, as well as to develop their sense of creativity and diversified thinking. (CSTB)
- 38. We would review the competition events and format of the biennially held Hong Kong Games (HKG). In order to further attract the young people to participate in the HKG, we will consider introducing new urban sports events which are popular among young people. We will also review the format of the individual sports competitions and consider adding age groups for aged under 18 so as to provide more opportunity for the participation of young people. (CSTB)

## **Latest Implementation Progress**

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In 2023-24, a total of 38 local Completed. young artists/groups have been provided with different platforms and performance opportunities to showcase their performances and creations through "New Force in Motion" Series, "Our Music Talents" Series, "Chinese Opera Festival 2023: Bless This Land - Cantonese Opera Showcase under the Bamboo Theatre at Victoria Park", "Cantonese Opera Day", "Tan Dun WE-Festival: World Premiere Symposium", "Institute of Imagination" Series and online programme "Theatre 101 - Theatre and You Know What".

Completed. The 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Games is held in 2023 and 2024. Amongst the eight sports competitions, the 5-on-5 basketball would be replaced by 3-on-3 basketball which is more popular among youth. Three age groups with 15 or below, 16 to 17 and 18 or above have been introduced for athletics, swimming and individual sports including badminton, table-tennis and tennis competitions to provide more opportunity for youth to participate in the Hong Kong Games. For team sports competitions, the number of teams nominated by each district has been increased from one to two or three teams to encourage wider public participation in the Hong Kong Games. The athlete selection started in July 2023 and would be completed by January 2024. The inter-district sports competitions would be held from March to June 2024.

In April and May 2024, we will introduce urban sports events, including sport climbing, breaking and skateboarding as demonstration sports competitions to encourage and attract wider

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participation in the 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Games especially for young people.

#### **Empowerment - Promote Positive Values**

"Values 39. We have implemented the Education Curriculum Framework" (Pilot Version) in secondary schools. Building on the features and needs in students' stages of development, the framework lists the learning expectations on their attitudes and behaviours in different domains personal, family, (e.g. community, national and global domains). On this ground, it is to develop students' ability to, on the basis of positive values and traditional Chinese ethics, analyse objectively and make reasonable judgement in different issues they may encounter at different developmental stages so that they could take proper action when facing choices, and challenges and frustrations in their future life. Adopting the Chinese culture as the backbone, it provides schools with a framework across various disciplines/curriculum areas to promote values education. (EDB)

Completed. Following the roll-out of patriotic education announced in the Chief Executive's 2023 Policy Address, the EDB announced the enrichment of the "Values Education Curriculum Framework (Pilot Version)" in December 2023. It includes (1) emphasising further the role of Chinese culture as the backbone of values education; and (2) optimising the priority values and attitudes (PVAs) – extending the existing PVA "Care for Others" to "Benevolence" and adding "Filial Piety" and "Unity". Schools should nurture students from the aspects of the interests, well-being and security of individuals, groups and the country; help them develop national identity and a sense of civic responsibility from a young age, as well as to think about how to maintain national security and contribute to the country.

### **Empowerment - Enhance Youth Rehabilitation**

40. To provide more comprehensive support for young persons in custody (PICs) who wish to continue their studies, the Correctional Services Department (CSD) signed a memorandum of understanding with the Hong Kong Metropolitan University (HKMU) on 24 October 2022 to affirm the long-term partnership between the CSD and HKMU in education and development of strategies to assist the

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rehabilitation of inmates, including credit transfers and programme articulation for PICs who were/have enrolled in post-secondary programmes prior to their imprisonment, and financial assistance by the HKMU to inmates enrolled in its programmes to help them complete their postsecondary studies. (SB)

41. In recent years, quite a number of persons who have committed crimes under the influence of radical ideas have been admitted to correctional institutions. The CSD is actively implementing the Project PATH, under which a number of suitable rehabilitation programmes have been developed for PICs to help them rebuild positive values and face positively the challenges ahead. These new or enhanced programmes include: :

"Youth Lab" Psychological Counselling Programme: The CSD has enhanced its existing psychological counselling services by setting up a psychological counselling new programme, Youth Lab, to helps young **PICs** manage emotions through mindfulness practice and art therapy, so as to enable them to undergo rehabilitation psychological and rebuilding, thereby enhancing their thinking process and respect of the law. The project was officially launched on 6 July 2022 at the Pik Uk Correctional Institution.

All four newly set up Multi-Completed. purpose Family and Rehabilitation Service Centres (MFRSCs) have commenced operation. The MFRSCs located in Shau Kei Wan, Sheung Shui, Tuen Mun, and Sha Tin were officially inaugurated on 26 October 2022, 21 December 2022, 24 March 2023, and 27 March 2023 respectively. Separately, in order to enhance psychological and counselling services for young PICs and those under supervision after release, the CSD launched the "Youth Lab" on 6 July 2022 and then commenced service of the "Change Lab" in the MFRSC in Shau Kei Wan on 26 October 2022. In addition, the CSD rolled out "Project JET" scheme in late October 2022, providing more employment opportunities (including those in the GBA) for young PICs and rehabilitated persons.

- "Change Lab" Community-based Psychological Service Centre: The CSD also sets up a community-based psychological service centre, Change Lab, to provide communitybased psychological counselling for young PICs after release, assisting those young people under statutory supervision order build confidence and psychological resilience for overcoming difficulties and resisting temptations, as well as strengthen the relationships between supervisees and their families, thereby breaking the cycle of crime. The Change Lab is located in the first multi-purpose family rehabilitation service centre in Shau Kei Wan and has commenced service on 26 October 2022.
- "The Project JET" Life Planning Project: In end-October 2022, the CSD launched the Project JET, a life planning project, to arrange for various enterprises to participate in life planning programmes and provide more employment opportunities for young PICs and rehabilitated persons, including the arrangement of more professional internships such accounting, management trainees and fashion design, so that they can further develop their potential and contribute to the community after release. The "Local Programme" will arrange for various local enterprises to provide local employment information and

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internship opportunities, while the "Greater Bay Area Programme" will invite businessmen and major enterprises with operations in the GBA to participate in the project and introduce the latest development and employment situation of the GBA to young PICs and rehabilitated persons who wish to work in the GBA. They will also be offered internship positions in the GBA to help them seize the development opportunities in the GBA after release.

"Understanding History is the Beginning of Knowledge" Educational Initiative: In 2022, the CSD has optimised the "Understanding History is the Beginning of Knowledge" educational initiative with the theme of "Road to Reunion", encompassing online seminars and technological elements such as virtual reality (VR) and e-sports activities to help PICs understand Chinese history culture, enhance their national identity and encourage them to treasure the opportunities and look to the future. (SB)

The LD is exploring with the CSD on encouraging employers to provide on-thejob training for rehabilitated youths through the Youth Employment and Training Programme, so as to enhance them

Completed. The collaboration has been running smoothly since its implementation in December 2022 and will be carried out continuously.

### **Empowerment - Promote Positive Thinking**

43. Apart from the regular subvention to the 11 uniformed groups, the HYAB will provide recurrent subvention to the Hong Kong Army Cadets Association from 2022-23 onwards to enhance support for youth development and national education. (HYAB)

Completed. The HYAB has started to provide recurrent subvention to the Hong Kong Army Cadets Association from 2022-23 onwards to enhance support for youth development and national education.

### **Empowerment - Promote an Innovation and Technology Culture**

44. To enhance young people's understanding of 5G and its potential for applications, and to make use of 5G to improve learning Office environment. the ofthe Communications Authority (OFCA) plans to organise an inter-school competition on 5G application in 2023. The competition aims to promote the integrated application of 5G and STEM-related knowledge and skills among secondary school students, thereby fostering their innovative thinking, collaboration and problemsolving skills. Participating students are required to design solutions using 5G or 5G-enabled tools to improve the campus environment, learning environment, and the neighbourhood. (CEDB)

Completed. The OFCA received a total of 33 submissions from 29 secondary schools at the end of May 2023. The first and the final rounds were held in August and November 2023, respectively. The Award Presentation Ceremony was held in December 2023 to announce the results of the competition.

### **Empowerment - Make Use of Life-wide Learning Grant/Activities**

45. Provide public sector schools (including special schools) with a recurrent Life-wide Learning Grant to support schools in taking forward life-wide learning with enhanced efforts. Depending individual circumstances, schools may use the grant flexibly to organise more out-ofclassroom experiential learning activities for students in different learning and curriculum areas, so that students can have more lively and enriched learning experiences for broadening their horizons, enhancing their motivation and interest in learning, and fostering their whole-person development. (EDB)

Completed. The EDB will continue to disburse Life-wide Learning Grant to public sector schools annually.

46. Collaborate with various local organisations and NGOs to support schools in providing students with more all-round diversified and learning opportunities in areas of community service, physical and aesthetic development, career-related experiences, etc. Students are encouraged to take an active role in caring for the needy in the community, participate in more physical and aesthetic group activities that are beneficial to their physical and mental well-being, and broaden their horizons through out-of-classroom experiential learning activities, thereby enhancing their spirit to serve and sense of responsibility, and developing an active and healthy lifestyle as well as positive thinking. (EDB)

Completed. The revamped Life-wide Learning Activity Databank was launched in June 2023 to support schools in providing more out-of-classroom experiential learning activities. As of the end of December 2023, 15 professional development programmes related to life-wide learning were held for teachers in the 2023/24 school year. The cumulated number of local organisations and NGOs collaborating with the EDB is over 60.

## **Latest Implementation Progress**

### **Empowerment - Support non-Chinese Speaking Youth**

47. The EDB provides all-encompassing support for non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) students from pre-primary to secondary education through a series of measures. In addition to providing additional funding to schools as well as major curriculum-related learning and teaching resources, the EDB offers teacher training and professional support, thereby strengthening the support for NCS students to learn Chinese and fostering an inclusive learning environment. The EDB has also implemented other supplementary measures, which include encouraging parents of NCS children to enrol their children in local kindergartens so that they would adapt to the local education system and gain exposure to the Chinese language and learn the language as early as possible; providing summer bridging programmes to help NCS students at the junior primary levels adapt to the classroom setting and consolidate their Chinese learning at the junior primary levels; and providing parent education programmes especially for parents of NCS students so that they would support and encourage their children to master the Chinese language and gain better understanding of the multiple pathways available to their children. Besides, career exploration activities have been offered to facilitate NCS students' preparation for further studies and career pursuits. NCS school

Completed. The relevant policy measures have been implemented in full swing. Details of the latest progress are as follows:

- Additional funding for schools: All schools admitting NCS students are provided with additional funding depending on the number of NCS students admitted.
- Learning and teaching resources: The EDB has been continuously developing diversified learning and teaching resources to provide teachers with guidelines and support in curriculum planning, learning and teaching and assessment. All these resources have been uploaded to the EDB website and will be updated on an ongoing basis.
- Teacher training and professional support: The EDB has been continuously organising professional development programmes to enhance teachers' professional capabilities. In the 2022/23 school year, around 3 390 teachers from about 740 primary and secondary schools have participated in the seminars and workshops organised by the EDB. Moreover, about 90 secondary and primary schools as well as about 60 kindergartens have joined the school-based support services for teachers who teach NCS students the Chinese language. In the 2023/24 school year, as at end-December 2023, around 900 secondary and primary school teachers have participated in the seminars and workshops organised by the EDB. Besides, about 80 secondary and primary schools as well as about 40 kindergartens have joined the school-based

- support services for teachers who teach NCS students the Chinese language.
- Other complementary measures (including the Summer Bridging Programme, parent education programmes especially for parents of NCS students, career exploration activities and vocational Chinese language courses): In the 2022/23 and 2023/24 school years (as at end-December 2023), the beneficiary counts are 3 600 and 2 400 respectively, including NCS students and their parents, as well as NCS school leavers.

#### **Contribution - Encourage Young People to Participate in Community Contribution**

48. Establish the Youth Community Contribution Committees in 18 districts for young people to offer their views on district development and works projects, and re-organise the existing District Youth Programme Committees into District Youth Development and Civic Education Committees. The two committees will be opened up for young people to nominate themselves participate. (HYAB)

Completed. The HAD established the District Youth Community Building Committee and the District Youth Development and Civic Education Committee in 18 districts across the territory in April 2023, and invited self-nominations to the Committees in January 2023 which attracted close to 1 100 applications. About 330 applicants have joined the Committees as members. Each of the Committees consists of 20 to 30 members, whose average age is below 35. Over one-third of members are self-nominated young people aged between 16 and 35.
